

English Heritage Grade II* listing details

Remains of North Guannock Gate with flanking walls. Late C13, the remains consolidated and romanticised in 1800s. Brick, carrstone and ashlar. Central pointed dying arch springing from square turrets with a crenellated parapet, repeated on turrets. One arched opening right and left below a punched oculus and more crenellations. Crenellated walls run north and south from this point: 3 segmental brick niches to each serving arrow slits. The whole is a symmetrical Picturesque garden composition.
